WEST NILE VIRUS UPDATE

The federal Centers for Disease Control (CDC) reported as of August 14, 2012, there have been 693 cases of West Nile Virus - the highest number of cases reported to CDC through this point in the summer since the virus was first detected in the United States in 1999. Over 80 percent of the cases have been reported from six states – more than half of them in Texas. In California, while there have been 23 reported cases, only one person is reported to have died from the disease.

The CDC warns that people over 50 are more likely to develop serious symptoms of West Nile if they do get sick and should take extra precautions to avoid mosquito bites.

NEW TESTING EXPECTED SOON FOR HEPATITIS C IN BABY BOOMERS

Hepatitis C is an unrecognized health crisis in the United States, according to the CDC. This life-threatening infection affects an estimated 3.2 million Americans, most of whom are “baby boomers” (those born from 1945 through 1965). Diagnosing Hepatitis C is key because many people do not realize they are infected. The longer the infection goes undetected the greater the risk of developing serious liver disease, including liver cancer and cirrhosis.

To identify more hidden infections and provide prompt and appropriate care and treatment, the CDC is proposing a one-time Hepatitis C testing for all baby boomers. Recommendations for instituting the one-time, national treatment effort will be finalized later this year. For more information, go to:

COMMUNITY LIVING SUPPORT BENEFIT WAIVER

Effective July 1, 2012, the San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFDPH), through a federal waiver, began assisting eligible individuals to move into available community settings and to exercise increased control and independence over their lives. A person eligible for the Community Living Support Benefit (CLSB) Waiver must:

- be a resident of San Francisco;
- be at least age 21 years or over; and
- be either homeless and at imminent risk of entering a nursing facility, or reside in a nursing facility and want to be discharged to a community setting.

Other eligibility conditions apply.

CLSB Waiver community settings are limited to State-approved housing, which includes community care facilities licensed by the Community Care Licensing Division (CCLD) of the California Department of Social Services and Direct Access to Housing sites operated by the SFDPH. CREATING INCLUSIVE SERVICES FOR LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL AND TRANSGENDER OLDER ADULTS

It is estimated there are 1.5 million adults over age 65 who identify as lesbian, gay or bisexual in the United States. By 2030, those estimates are expected to rise to nearly three million among those who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender (LGBT).
