Total NMOHC Payment Standard	<u>\$991.00*</u>

The NMOHC Payment Standard includes the following components:

Room and Board	\$425.00
Care and Supervision (maximum)	<u>\$452.00</u>
Amount Payable for Basic Services	\$877.00¹
Personal and Incidental Needs Allowance (Must be provided to the recipient) (minimum)	<u>\$114.00</u>
	<u>\$991.00</u>

*Amounts are double for SSI/SSP couples.

¹ NOTE: Recipients who have income in addition to their SSI/SSP check (for example, a pension, Social Security retirement, or disability benefits) can be charged the **\$877.00** amount for basic services plus an additional \$20. Because federal rules do not count the first \$20 of a recipient's income against his/her SSI/SSP grant, an SSI/SSP recipient with other income has an extra \$20 that people who receive only an SSI/SSP check do not have. Neither federal nor state law restricts the recipient in how this additional \$20 amount is spent. Thus, if the recipient agrees in the admission agreement to pay the additional \$20 for basic services, the facility may charge the additional amount.
